The Proposal

West Gippsland Catchment Management Authority proposes to issue a works on waterway permit pursuant to section 130, 219 and 287ZC of the *Water Act 1989* and by-laws No 3 and 2014-1 of the Waterways Protection 2014.

The permit would allow the construction of a crossing over Wilderness Creek at 120 Walsh & Gibsons Road, Driffield.

The permit application was submitted by David Jeffrey, being the Crown land licensee and adjoining landowner on both sides of the creek.

The proposed crossing is a pipe culvert design with rock spoils, containing two rows of three pipes, over an area 4.5 metres long, 2.1 metres high, 2.44 metres wide.

The purpose of the works is for moving livestock and farm machinery within the applicant's farm.

The *Native Title Act 1993* (NTA) requires DEECA to consult and seek comments from the Traditional Owners of Native Title lands and incorporate appropriate conditions into consent to use and develop the land.

We understand that the proponent may also be obliged under Cultural Heritage legislation to contact the Gunaikurnai RAP body concerning this project and we will advise them of those responsibilities as a matter of standard process. However, if you would also like DELWP to raise some specific conditions on cultural heritage protection matters in the exercise of your native title right to protect cultural heritage as part of this formal commentary and approvals process, we will be happy to do so at your direction.

Further, your comments on how this proposal might affect your other native title rights and interests, and how that can be managed or addressed as part of this approvals process are also keenly sought.

These recognised rights and interests include the:

- right to have access to or enter and remain on the land and waters;
- right to use and enjoy the land and waters;
- right to take the resources of the land and waters for the purposes of satisfying personal, domestic or communal needs, but not for any commercial purposes;
- right to protect and maintain places and areas on the land and waters which are of importance according to Gunaikurnai traditional laws and customs;
- right to camp
- right to engage in cultural activities;
- right to engage in rituals and ceremonies;
- right to hold meetings and gatherings;
- right to teaching and learning about the physical, spiritual and cultural attributes of places and areas of importance.

Please note that the 'non-extinguishment' principle applies to these works and your native title rights will continue to exist over the site.

The Department intends to advise the proponent that the project can proceed after 40 days from the date of this notification have elapsed. We would appreciate the opportunity to discuss this proposal however in the meantime please contact Matt Kelly at the following details.








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Parish Plan of Narracan







The West Gippsland Catchment Management Authority (the Authority) regulates works and activities in, on or over designated waterways within the Authority's waterway management district.

- 1. A Works on Waterways Permit is a written statement from the Authority that certain works or activities may proceed at a certain location, subject to conditions.
- 2. Maps of the waterways the Authority has declared to be designated are available for inspection at its office at 16 Hotham Street, Traralgon, free of charge during normal business hours.
- A person who intends to construct or carry out any works in, on or over a designated waterway must first apply
 to the Authority for authorisation in accordance with the Water Act 1989. Works must not commence until the
 Works on Waterways permit is issued.
- 4. The applicant must lodge with the Authority a completed application form and a complete description of the works.
- 5. In determining whether or not to grant a Permit, the Authority will consider the effect or likely effect granting of the Permit may have on any designated waterway within the Authority's district.
- 6. Assessment of the structural adequacy of the works is not the responsibility of the Authority.
- 7. The Authority may ask the applicant for more information, and may give notice of the application to persons the Authority considers may be affected by the application. The Authority may require the applicant to give this notice.
- 8. In making its decision, the Authority will take into account the views of persons who may be affected by the application.
- 9. The Authority is entitled to refuse the application, giving its reasons for doing so.
- 10. The Authority is entitled to impose conditions when granting a Permit in accordance with the Authority's powers and functions under the *Water Act 1989*.
- 11. The issue of a Works on Waterways Permit does not remove the applicant's responsibility to apply for any authorisation or permission necessary under any other Act with respect to anything authorised by the Permit. The Guidance Note below provides more details about the types of approvals which may be required.
- 12. A Permit shall be subject to time limits and will expire under certain circumstances. Any renewed Permit, if granted, may be subject to renewed conditions.
